Student Discipline Policy

Policy

South Louisiana Community College maintains student disciplinary procedures which are applicable to any student or student organization that is charged with a violation of the Student Code of Conduct. These procedures are designed to allow for fact-finding and decision-making in the context of an educational community, and to encourage students to accept responsibility for their own actions. The intent is to provide adequate procedural safeguards to protect the rights of the individual student and the legitimate interests of the College. All student records generated during the information gathering/decision-making process associated with these procedures are subject to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The College's Student Code of Conduct outlines the proceedings, due process, and steps for appeals pertaining to disciplinary actions. The procedures are published in the College Catalog and/or Student Handbook and are reviewed periodically at the direction of the Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs.
